I went back to school and got a Masters Degree in Education and my teaching certification. I went on to teach 4th and 5th grade for the next twenty-three years.

Ginny and I have two children, Tricia and Bill, both Iowa State graduates. Bill pledged Alpha Iota in the fall of 1996 and I reconnected with the brotherhood at 325 Ash. At that time, one of my pledge brothers, Mike Owen, was a university professor and the academic advisor to the house.
